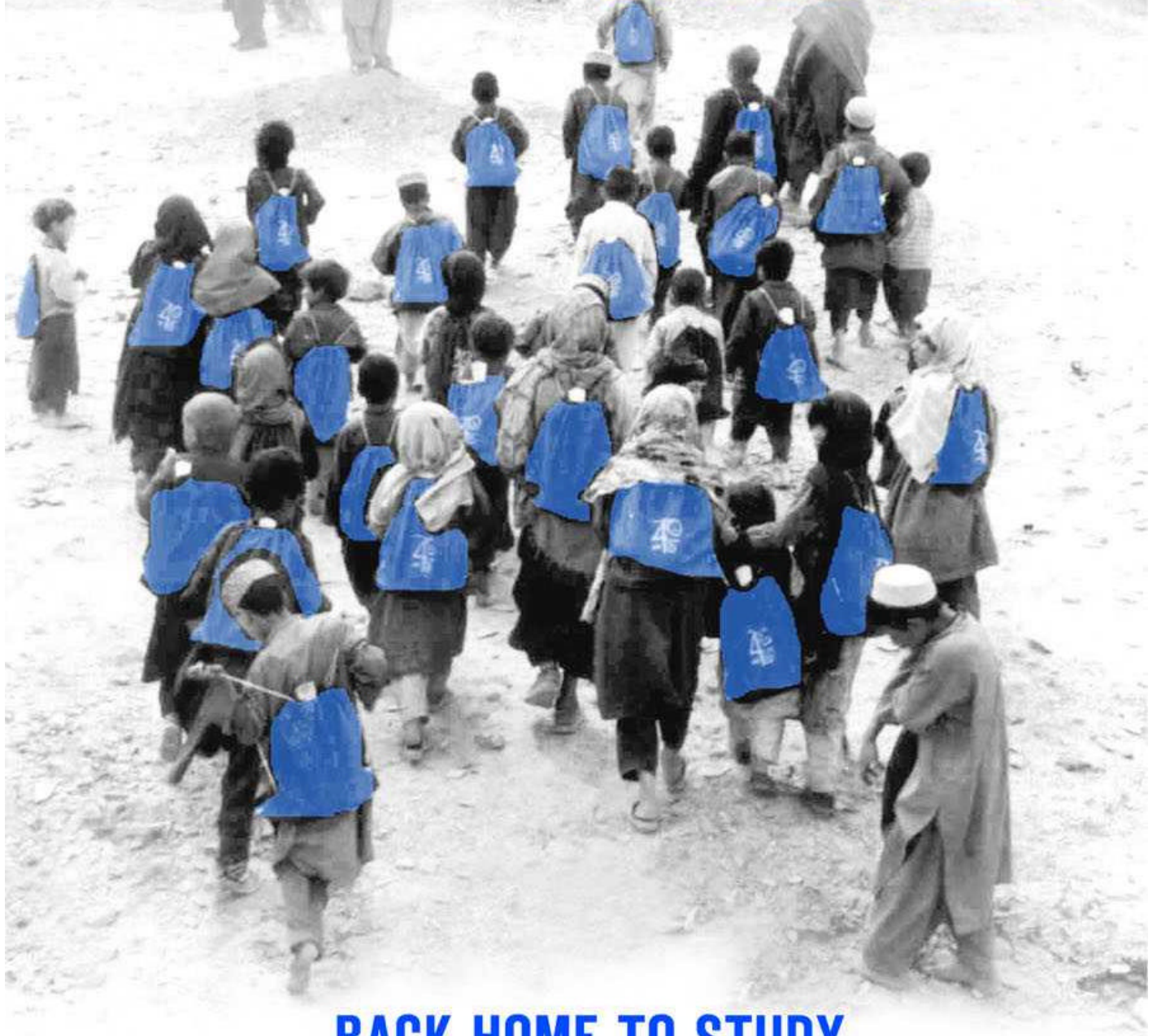

Because Afghan children deserve a future.

This small gesture can make a big change in the life of a child.

After September 11, 2001, many Americans looked for ways to act – to make a positive contribution in a world that suddenly seemed more uncertain and more dangerous – but also more interconnected.

The stories of rebuilding the education system in Afghanistan have touched our hearts: stories of children eagerly flooding into newly reopened schools. For the first time in many years, Afghan girls can go to school.

We invite you to help us remember that those children still need our help. In the past year we at AED have distributed 40,000 BluePacks filled with basic school supplies to Afghan children residing in refugee camps scattered on the border with Pakistan. At the request of the Afghan Embassy, AED is extending that program to reach children all over the struggling countryside and cities of Afghanistan.

AED's BluePack is a simple, low-cost and low-tech tool that will put the minimal tools needed to practice writing and arithmetic at home and at school into the hands of Afghan children. Just as every parent in America provides pencils and notebooks for their child to practice lessons at home, so too every Afghan parent wants their child to have a chalk slate, traditional wooden writing board and a bamboo pen to practice their lessons in a country where pencils, pens and paper are an unattainable luxury.

Funds for The BluePack Project are being collected from individuals and partners like you.

AED's goal is to raise \$2 million to produce and distribute 200,000 BluePacks. A donation of just \$10 will provide a BluePack for one eager-to-learn Afghan child.

And that's not all. Part of that \$10 will go to help rebuild Afghanistan's education system (through activities like teacher training), which, like the children, has been ravaged by wars, natural disasters and poverty.
